POLICY PRIORITIES

Over the past several months, the anti-genocide movement has witnessed a number of remarkable policy and legislative successes, including the U.S. government's full-scale mobilization in preparation for the Southern Sudanese independence referendum, the appointment of high-level special envoys for Southern Sudan and Darfur, and the passage of S.Con.Res. 71, the genocide prevention resolution.

Over the next three months, the anti-genocide movement will face a number of challenges, and our policy priorities must adjust accordingly.

During the upcoming semester, **STAND** will prioritize the following policy outcomes:

Sudan

- High-level U.S. and international engagement in post-referendum issues, especially the status of Sudan's Abyei region
- Active U.S. support for a reinvigorated Darfur peace process, with high-level international engagement in a neutral location
- The continued maintenance of U.S. economic sanctions, prior to the completion of the Darfur peace process

Genocide Prevention

- The introduction of a genocide prevention bill in at least one chamber of Congress
